Bush & Beach: The Severin commitment in Kenya

March 2009:

- Kenya's first safari spa, the KENBALI Spa at Severin Safari Camp, opens its doors
- Severin Safari Camp is the first holiday area in Kenya to receive the international hallmark of excellence for service efforts and spa quality („Service Quality Standard“, „International Spa Standard“) by TÜV Rheinland. Additionally, Severin Sea Lodge in Mombasa also receives the TÜV certificate for service quality

Wellness gone wild

- KENBALI Spa offers a wellness area of 430 sq. m. with traditional African beauty treatments, massages and a large Ying-Yang spring water pool
- The four-star Severin Safari Camp is located in Tsavo National Park, the biggest park in Kenya and home to over 10 000 red elephants
- The classy and luxurious camp is stretched over 25 hectares of savannah and comprises of 21 comfortable tents, 6 luxurious suites and the à la carte "Out of Africa" restaurant. The adjoining Kitani Camp offers 8 self catering Bandas
- New at the camp: the "Baraza" conference tent for 30 persons
- Free-of-charge W-Lan within Severin Safari Camp
- It is the main goal to protect the environment with solar technology, high energy efficiency, a biological waste water treatment plant and strict waste separation. This is to ensure the sensitive ecosystem of the African wilderness are protected and not destroyed

Pleasure at the beach:

- The Severin Sea Lodge at Mombasa's North coast is featured again in the "TUI Environmental Champion" at the end of 2008
- The hotel with 200 rooms boasts of its own solar facility for hot water, a hotel owned biological farm and a waste water treatment plant to European standards.
- Renovated superior comfort class rooms offer Lamu designed furniture and flat screens
- The popular beach hotel has for years been the hotel of choice for air line crew like Air Berlin, Condor and many others

The Severin family in Africa:

- He travels to Africa for hunting and becomes a hotelier: At the beginning of the 70s, Rudolf Schulte sen. – producer of electric appliances – founds the Severin Sea Lodge for his family and friends. The hotel within a palm grove located at the Indian Ocean today is a classic in Kenya's tourism industry
- After his parents died, son Severin Schulte takes over the company at the age of 27.
- As a 20 year-old, he crosses the African continent with his own car, starts up the first Severin coffee maker at Brazil's Copacabana
- 1979, Severin Schulte founds the Severin Touristik Ltd. and further develops the touristic activities within Kenya and the Sauerland
- His wife Cornelia Schulte and three grown-up kids share the passion for Africa with the now 55 year-old
